Who can participate?

Veterans aged 18-70 without current severe substance abuse disorder. We are looking for two groups of Veterans:

- Veterans experiencing suicidal thoughts or behaviors
- Veterans without current suicidal thoughts or behaviors



What is the time commitment?


Up to 5 total visits over 2 years: 4 research visits and 1 brain scan visit. Research visits last 1.5-3 hours. The MRI visit lasts 2 hours, but only about 1 hour is in the MRI.

ABOUT THE STUDY

Researchers at the Providence VA Medical Center want to better understand how patterns of brain activity and thinking may place some Veterans at greater risk for suicide.

We are looking for Veterans both with, and without, current thoughts of suicide to participate in this study -- even Veterans who have never thought about suicide may be eligible.

We aim to identify brain patterns that differ between Veterans at low and high risk for suicide so we can develop better treatments for suicide.

WHAT HAPPENS DURING

THE STUDY?


- An initial assessment with the investigator and research team to determine eligibility (1.5-3 hours).

- Visit activities include interviews, questionnaires, and computer games.


